Governor Jon Corzine, Secretary of State Nina Mitchell Wells, and Commissioner of Education Lucille Davy are sponsoring an informative, free public celebration for all New Jerseyans -- children, parents, teachers, mayors and anybody with a love of our state.

Outstanding students and teachers will be saluted for their achievements in the field of history. Examples of student history video documentaries and projects will be shown. Two priceless historical documents will be on display: The actual June 24, 1664 royal grant that established New Jersey and a rare, original copy of the Declaration of Independence printed July 4, 1776.
