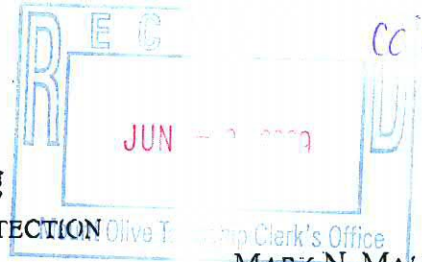

NJDEP/NJSLOM - DOUBLE HEADER Brownfield Forum and Ballgame

Time is running out to register for the Municipal Roundtable sessions co-sponsored by NJDEP and the NJ State League of Municipalities. The Roundtable sessions will provide an update on Brownfields redevelopment and site remediation programs and possibilities in our Garden State pursuant to the recently enacted Site Remediation Reform Act.

The Sessions will discuss funding to investigate, remediate and redevelop contaminated sites through grant programs administered by the DEP and the NJEDA. Staff will provide information about how your municipality can benefit by these programs. A consultation period at the end of the meeting will provide you with an opportunity to meet individually with DEP personnel to discuss the topics that most interest you.

The Roundtable Session on Remediation and Redevelopment will run on **Tuesday, June 16th** from 1:00 PM to 5:30 PM in the ITC Conference Room at 300 Riverview Plaza, Trenton.
