

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE

WHEREAS, Callaremi Pontiac, which has been in the automotive business for 52 years and has been in business with General Motors (GM) for 37 years, has received a notice from GM to “wind down”; and

WHEREAS, this action has undoubtedly been taken based upon President Obama’s direction to GM that costs must be reduced on the basis that the Federal Government is making certain investments within GM; and

WHEREAS, it is believed that some of the dealerships that are receiving “wind down” notices from GM have been politically selected; and

WHEREAS, Callaremi Pontiac has been an important member of the Mount Olive business community; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Mount Olive objects to the “wind down” notice and asks that GM reconsider; and

WHEREAS, the Township endorses the legislation known as “Automobile Dealer Economic Rights Restoration Act of 2009”

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Mount Olive, County of Morris, State of New Jersey, that it does hereby endorse the attempt by Callaremi Pontiac to remain in active operation and the Township Council further endorses the legislation known as “Automobile Dealer Economic Rights Restoration Act of 2009”
