



Dear Mayor:		
As reported earlier in the month, the League of Municipalities partnered with the New Jersey Cable Telecommunications Association (NJCTA) and its member companies to produce an hour-long panel discussion on the growing mortgage foreclosure crisis and the impacts on local communities. The program is televised statewide on NJCTA member cable systems in New Jersey. This program reaches out to all our residents and explain how foreclosures can impact them, even if they are not going through foreclosure. The League wants residents to understand how their local governments are addressing this issue.
